Loose Plate Offering for February is the St. Peter's Youth Mission Trip: St. Peter's Summer Youth Mission Trip to West Virginia has been chosen the recipient of the February Outreach ministry. This is such great news! We really appreciate the opportunity to share with you our annual trip to Brothers' Keeper which is in its 20th summer providing residential home repair to Jackson County residents in need. Over the years we've really done it all. We tarred numerous leaky trailer roofs, constructed wheelchair ramps, replaced decking and porches, and painted rooms. Every year the work is a little different but the relationships we build are the same.

The folks we help are similar in their need for assistance and many are living well below the poverty level. Most of our friends are suffering from a chronic illness, handicaps, and age. So many times, conditions have been drastically deteriorating for years but pride has kept them from asking for help. We all know how hard it is to ask for help! Often times our resident is a widow or widower without much family or friends to check in on them. This leads us to the really important reason we are there. It is to build relationships. To let these folks know they are God's children, they are loved, we are in this life together, and we are here to help.

JOURNEY TO THE CENTER: Exploring Christianity, Episcopalian Style. Journey to the Center is a 13 week exploration of the Christian faith as it is lived out in our Episcopal Church. We begin on Sunday, February 23 and conclude on Pentecost Sunday, May 31st.

There will be three "tracks" for this program. Track 1 will meet on 13 Sundays in the Chapel (time to be determined by the group). Track 2 will meet on 3 Sunday evenings and 3 Saturdays (from 9-2). Track 3 will be a self-study, with 3 Sunday evening meetings and 3 private meetings with Fr. Keith.

Journey to the Center was originally conceived as preparation for believer baptism, reception or confirmation. Over 3 decades, it has evolved into an all-purpose introduction to Anglican theology, tradition, spirituality and ethics. It requires a significant commitment of time, primarily in daily readings and journaling: about 20 minutes per day. It is appropriate for young people ages 15 - 100 (though precocious 12 year-olds have enjoyed it too!).

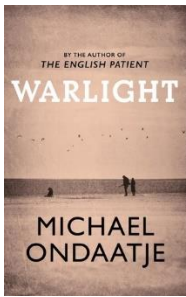
Newcomers Series: Explore & Connect: Attention Newcomers & First-time

St. Cecilia's Guild Book Discussion and tea will be Wednesday, February 19, 2020 at 3:00 pm at Tina Uible's house. The book, *Warlight* by Michael Ondaatje, will be discussed. Goodreads says "In a narrative as mysterious as memory itself – at once both shadowed and luminous – *Warlight* is a vivid, thrilling novel of violence and love, intrigue and desire. It is 1945, and London is still reeling from the Blitz and years of war. 14-year-old Nathaniel and his sister, Rachel, are apparently abandoned by their parents, left in the care of an enigmatic figure named The Moth. They suspect he might be a criminal, and grow both more convinced and less concerned as they get to know his eccentric crew of friends: men and women with a shared history, all of whom seem determined now to protect, and educate (in rather unusual ways) Rachel and Nathaniel. But are they really what and who they claim to be? A dozen years later, Nathaniel begins to uncover all he didn't know or understand in that time, and it is this journey – through reality, recollection, and imagination – that is told in this magnificent novel. St. Peter's parishioner Joseph Jacoby will lead the discussion. All are welcome!
