MARCH = LENT, 2020: REMEMBER

This year, the lunar liturgical calendar occurs so that the entire month of March will comprise the season of Lent. I just love this time of year because it sets before us both command and invitation. At the heart of the season is that extraordinary verb, both command and invitation: REMEMBER. Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return. Remember and confess your sins. Remember the story of God's people, Israel. Remember the ministry and self-offering of Jesus. Remember your baptism: remember who you are and whose you are.

There are so many ways you can observe the Lenten fast. You can truly fast in some or other fashion. You can embrace a new spiritual discipline. Whatever form your observance takes, let it have at its heart the work of remembering. Make it about drawing closer to God, and to the people with whom God has placed you.

For decades, Fred Rogers' simple message, that of loving each and every one of us just as we are and that we are all part of the same neighborhood, has been universally regarded and admired. This message should be familiar to us, as it is at the heart of Christianity and on Episcopal bumper stickers: *God loves you. No exceptions.*

“Love isn't a state of perfect caring. It is an active noun like struggle. To love someone is to strive to accept that person exactly the way he or she is, right here and now.” --Rev. Dr. Fred Rogers

Our Community Meal ministry is essentially the same as that of the Reverend Rogers'. We love our neighbors by providing them a delicious and nutritious warm meal in a welcoming atmosphere. Our guests regularly tell us how friendly, helpful and accepting St. Peter's is. 

Clergy Discretionary Fund

THANK YOU! Thank you to the many of you who made offerings last month, and all of last year, to fund the Clergy Discretionary Fund. St. Peter's folks have historically been very gracious and generous to this fund, but your kindness in the past year has been extraordinary. Please know that these funds are used wisely, to the best of my ability. The most common use is to make \$50 food cards and RTA day passes available to people in moments of acute financial crisis. The funds are also used to help pay rent and utilities for families in trouble. Now and then, the fund pays for food or other materials for parish events (such as pizza for Greening the Church). And, every once in a while, I use these funds to really help someone in crisis. Last month, I paid a few hundred dollars to a funeral home to assist a financially struggling family who lost a young son suddenly and unexpectedly. I also use these funds to help parish children and youth attend summer camps, mission trips, and service projects. Over the years, the number and variety of small, simple grants can't be counted.

One thing of which I hope you are aware is that YOU can call me and request funds for a sudden need of your own, or of someone you know and care for. These funds are entrusted to the St. Peter's clergy in order to respond quickly to unforeseen needs of all kinds. You give so generously. Please help me make that generosity available to anyone who needs it.

Whether you're new to St. Peter's or been a member for 20 years, Foyer Group is a fun and easy way for parishioners to gather together on a regular, but informal basis for purely social reasons – to get to know fellow parishioners at St. Peter's.


St. Peter's Lenten Retreat March 6-7 @ Centering Space
