Liturgical Volunteers Needed!

As we prepare to resume in-building worship at St. Peter's, we need your help. Liturgical volunteers are needed in order for our worship to take place. As more and more of us are vaccinated, it may be easier to make the decision to return to worship and to serve.

Beginning May 9th, we will be resuming services at 8:00 and 10:00 am on Sundays. **We are in need for 8:00 volunteers.** For EACH of the services we will need: 3 Ushers, 1 Crucifer/Acolyte, and 1 Lector/Intercessor. We will train you for these duties if you are willing to serve. ***Please indicate which service you prefer; we will schedule folks as best we are able to serve at their preferred service, but we really need everyone to be as flexible as possible.***

We remain under diocesan protocols for all services; i.e., only communion bread will be given, masks must be worn at all times, social distancing will be in place, and there **will still be no singing.**

A life well lived... Several weeks ago, Dave Tabar was our guest musician. One of his pieces he played was inspired by his father-in-law's experiences in World War II and those he shared with his beloved Yorkie, Smoky. Bill Wynne passed away on Monday, April 21, 2021. Therefore we thought we would share this information with our St. Peter's family. St. Peter's extends its deepest condolences to Dave, Donna and the entire Wynne and Tabar families. This is the news release following Bill's death.

We share the news today that Smoky The War Dog's owner, trainer and companion, William ("Bill") A. Wynne, age 99, recently passed into God's loving hands. He shared his final hours peacefully with his beloved family, whom he has deeply cherished. His stories, represented in a lifetime of word, photography, research, print and film, were especially poignant as he touched every individual with equal kindness, generosity and inspiration.

Bill Wynne is widely known as a historic WWII combat and reconnaissance photographer, NASA research photographer, Hollywood and television entertainer, writer-publisher, and Smoky's beloved friend. He is known further as PTSD therapy dog visionary, having visited wartime hospitals in the Southwest Pacific with his 4lb. Yorkshire Terrier, Smoky, as documented in his self-published book, "Yorkie Doodle Dandy." Post-war, Bill Wynne trained dogs in Hollywood including Warner Brothers' "Night Unto Night" directed by Don Siegel starring Ronald Reagan. Upon returning to Cleveland, Ohio he performed on live television every Sunday morning for 26 consecutive weeks with new tricks, as well as performing at regional veterans hospitals and orphanages.

He developed high-speed photographic camera technologies for NASA Lewis Research in their flight icing and crash-research programs, and later received the Brotherhood Award involving race relations for his photographic series published by the Cleveland Plain Dealer following John F. Kennedy's death. Recently, Bill was featured in the award-winning short film "Angel in a Foxhole," co-produced by Studio A Films LLC and Dean Love Films, while a new "Smoky Memorial" created by sculptor Susan Bahary was accepted into the National Air Force Museum at Wright-Patterson AFB in April, 2021.

Bill Wynne also lives in the hearts of many as a beloved son, husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather who dearly loved his family, and as a friend to all who were fortunate to meet, work, or engage with him.

Peace be with you, Bill. You truly made the world a better place to live in.
