Remembering Desmond Tutu

Desmond Mpilo Tutu died on December 26 at the age of 90. He was a South African Anglican bishop and theologian, known for his work as an anti-apartheid and human rights activist. He was Bishop of Johannesburg from 1985 to 1986 and then Archbishop of Cape Town from 1986 to 1996, in both

cases being the first black African to hold the position.

**Join us as we celebrate Epiphany/Twelfth Night!
Thursday, January 6 at 5:30 p.m. in the Chapel**

Epiphany, or the 12th day of Christmas, falls on January 6 and marks the official end to the festive season for many Christians. Until the 19th century, the Twelve Days of Christmas were celebrated and Epiphany was just about as big a celebration as Christmas Day.

The word 'Epiphany' comes from Greek word meaning “manifestation” or “appearing” referring to Jesus being revealed to the world. Epiphany combines three commemorations; the visit of the Magi led by the star of Bethlehem, the Baptism of Jesus and Jesus' first recorded miracle, changing water into wine at the wedding in Cana.

Christians have been celebrating Epiphany since the end of the 2nd century. In the West, Epiphany is usually associated with the visit of the Wise Men to Jesus. In the Episcopal Church we now celebrate the Baptism of Jesus on the first Sunday after Epiphany, and the miracle at Cana on the 2nd Sunday after Epiphany.

Join us as we celebrate Epiphany on Thursday, January 6, with a service at 5:30 pm in the chapel, followed by soup and fellowship.
