Welcome to St. Peter's! If you are attending services, please use the back glass door off the parking lot (where the elevator is located) or the front door to enter the church. At this time, the other two entrances will remain locked. If you need any assistance, please see one of the ushers or Tom Newman, St. Peter's Sexton. Masks are required in building at all times. Thank you for your cooperation.

To be more inclusive of our Parishioners who attend the 10 am service via Livestream, we are going to dispense with showing the stained-glass window during communion in favor of showing the distribution of the sacrament of communion in the middle aisle.

This means if you receive communion in the center aisle your image will be shown walking to communion and receiving the sacrament. By receiving communion in the center aisle, you will be deemed to have consented to your image being shown on the Livestream.

If you do not want your image to be shown, you will have the option of receiving communion in the right aisle (facing the altar), which is out of the screenshot of the Livestream. Communion in the right aisle will take place after distribution of communion in the middle aisle.



February Outreach Focus: St. Luke's: This month, our Outreach Ministry is St Luke's Episcopal Church. St. Peter's has a long association with St. Luke's and has supported its many ministries in the past. St. Luke's is now in transition as the parish participates in a search for a new rector. During this time, four deacons are assisting the Interim in the work of the parish and they will be joining us on January 30 to tell us about their ministries. We hope you are able to join us that day.

Here is their message to you:

"As Deacons we come to you to teach, to train, to challenge, to engage, to awaken. We can't do service until we listen, until we hear, until we see, "look at me", "see me". Deacons belong to the Bishop. We are extensions of the Bishop. Deacons serve the Church, so the Church can serve the world. You, here at St. Peter's, help do God's mission. We, at St. Luke's, could not do God's mission without your support, your servant-hood, your gifts, and your generous donations.

Central around the belief that individuals, groups and communities, have the gifts to address the needs they see around them, they see the homeless, the single mother, the chronically mentally ill, the addicts, those that don't have anywhere to go, they see "the outside and underside" and transformation takes place, and we become the Church that looks and acts like Jesus."

St. Luke's ministries include a Drive-thru Pantry, a Grab and Go Community Meal, and Your Neighbor's Cloak, clothing ministry, plus programming for youth.

The youth of St. Paul's have selected a place for the Summer 2022 (July 9th – July 16th) Mission Trip. Youth in grades 6 – 12 are invited to join us in a Multi Parish Mission Trip to The Episcopal Mission Center in Philadelphia, PA. The Episcopal Mission Center (EMC) is a social justice and retreat facility located on St. Luke's campus in the Germantown area of Philadelphia. The EMC seeks to instill missional living through authentic experience of urban ministry. We actively live out the 5 Marks of Mission of the Episcopal Church while valuing an ecumenical partnership with various peoples of backgrounds and faiths.

Groups will get an opportunity to work with their peers and forge the kind of unbreakable bonds that can only be made through the spiritual journey of service. While here, groups will work alongside our EMC team who will guide them in service projects and camp activities, as well as offer a new perspective into what it means to dedicate yourself to serving God and their community. Groups will also work with our EMC Service Site Partners, service organizations throughout the city committed to social justice in diverse and in-depth ways.

Our total cost for the trip will be **\$690** to cover food, day off excursion, transportation, and any miscellaneous expenses. **All** paperwork must be completed and turned in no later than **Wednesday, February 16, 2022** along with a deposit of **\$230** per individual. The balance is due by May 15th. Each church is responsible for their own transportation and transportation costs.
