Please let me know if this is something that you feel drawn to and I will arrange a time to get together. How about some young folks learning to be bell ringers? The way we do church is evolving as we are able to participate more fully, so now is the time to try something different, learn a new way to serve God.

Elsewhere in “the Net” you will find some new ideas for children and youth. After a two-year shut down it is a time to reimagine our offerings for young people, so I am really excited about the new initiatives.

How about the people who are unable to get to church? Maybe some people just need a ride, and I am sure we could help with that. However, for those for whom getting to church is just too much now, we can bring church to them. I know the Lay Eucharistic Visitor ministry was active at St. Peter's before COVID. Who feels called to continue that ministry, or maybe would like to learn more about it? Please let me know.

I am not asking you to load more onto your plate if you are already too busy, but if you feel drawn into a new ministry, you will discover how that can feed your soul, breathe new life into you and energize you, and that is what Spring is all about!


Flower Delivery People Wanted!



The April Outreach Focus of the Month is our own camp, retreat, and educational center for the Diocese of Ohio - Bellwether Farm. Its vision and mission, in part, is to “promote physical and spiritual wellness and fidelity to the environment while providing a sacred space that awakens our senses to all that is possible in God’s creation and live more lightly on the earth.” To that end, Bellwether is a working farm with sheep, goats, chickens, bees and a cow! All meals at the center are served farm to table with all the appropriate recycling/sustainability practices. During the warmer months, guests are encouraged to help gather the very food they will eat while at the farm. Chef Lonny never fails to serve the most delicious meals!

Located in Wakeman, OH along the Vermillion River, Bellwether is an idyllic setting for young ones to enjoy a camp experience. The lake on the property provides the opportunity for swimming, canoeing, and fishing. Campers stay in beautiful wooden cabins nestled in the gorgeous woods that surround the center. Those woods provide miles of hiking, foraging, and exploration. Campers also enjoy the fellowship surrounding campfires, music, arts and crafts, and worship. They too will participate in farm life through harvesting their own food and animal life. Please visit the Bellwether website to learn more about the camp offerings.

Bellwether’s doors are by no means only open to the youth of the diocese! Congregants across the diocese come to enjoy spiritual programming, retreats, and other workshops throughout the year. The Grange (main gathering space and dining hall) has beautiful conference rooms fully operational with technology for meetings. Overnight accommodations are provided in fully furnished cabins for double and single occupancy. The worship barn overlooks the woods and therefore offers a peaceful and picturesque setting for spiritual gatherings. With Covid restrictions

beginning to lift throughout northeast Ohio, please keep an eye out for the special programming Bellwether will offer throughout the summer and fall. I know St. Peter’s vestry has always looked forward to and enjoyed their annual retreat out at Bellwether.

The Recipe for JOY

- 1 Open heart for hearing and understanding
- 2 ounces Reflection
- 1 hr. with someone you love
- 1 3/4 cup Caring for Others
- 1 Tablespoon Understanding
- 4 ounces of Thankfulness
- 2 ½ pints of Community
- 1 Person to share your joy with
- 6 pinches of Prayer

All the ingredients should be poured into one large mixing bowl in the order described below:

Begin with 1 open heart for hearing and understanding and add 3 pinches of prayer. Then add 2 ounces of Reflection and 1 ¾ cup of caring for others. Stir together.

Next add in the 2 ½ pints of Community, 1 Tablespoon of Understanding, and 4 ounces of Thankfulness.

Then, take your time, and add in 1 hr. of time spent with someone you love. Add the remaining 3 pinches of prayer. Finally, add at least 1 person to share your joy with, stir and enjoy!

New Beginnings!

For many of us, bringing children to church during the pandemic has been difficult. We have been sandwiched by needing to protect our kids from exposures (particularly when vaccines were not available to them) and protecting our vulnerable relatives from catching COVID from them. But as the risk of transmission becomes less threatening, our focus is turning – returning to our youth and keeping the church an important part of their lives. This is not the easiest undertaking after 2 years of “not having to go to church.”

With the help of Reverend Anna Sutterisch, we are welcoming back our families in a variety of creative ways:

April 3 Ribbon Cutting – 10:00 a.m. Service

Children’s Own Church Space!

St. Peter’s will dedicate a permanent worship space for children in the East Transept where children can attend the service without having to “sit still.” The area will be defined by a comfy carpet and seats and children can color, look at books and still attend the service. 2 adults will staff the children’s worship area, thus allowing families to worship together ... and apart!

Youth

While our youth (typically 11 and up) may be mildly amused by the children’s worship area, it is safe to say that they want and need more than a “magic carpet” to stay engaged with church. During the 10:00 service on April 3rd, youth will have an opportunity to meet with a few parents and share with us how they can best connect with God and the church. This promises to be an enlightening opportunity to create the beginnings of a youth program which will attract tweens and teens and offer them a structure that will keep them engaged and wanting to come to church.

Safeguarding God’s Children

As many of you know, the Safeguarding God’s Children program is a required course for any adult working with children and youth in the Episcopal Diocese. Classes are available online and we encourage every parent, interested volunteer, and church leader to take the course. In this way, we can offer more opportunities for children, youth and families.

Coffee Hour & Fellowship Coffee Hour is Back!!!


