## July Outreach Focus of the Month: May Dugan Center



The founders laid the groundwork in 1969 for the May Dugan Center (MDC) now – a respected multi-service center serving residents of Cleveland's Near West neighborhoods and the Greater Cleveland community. From the beginning, they

were committed to providing wrap-around services to people who faced barriers to healthcare, food, and employment, and for nearly 53 years, the Center has remained constant to its original intent.

The six core programs of the May Dugan Center are in action every day: helping educate people for school and work, preventing infant mortality, assisting victims of crime, keeping seniors living independently, feeding the hungry, and comforting those in need of mental health and addiction services. By strengthening these vital self-sustaining opportunities, our clients are empowered to manage their lives, health, and well-being.

The Center's programming has been recognized for its innovative nature as well as receiving a 4-star rating from Charity Navigator. This high rating demonstrates that May Dugan exceeds industry standards and outperforms most charities in this field, showing strong financial health and commitment to accountability and transparency.

Some key utilization measures from 2021 and 2022:

- One Million meals provided since March 2020
  - Largest food pantry in the 6-county area
  - Over 4,000 hours of learning through virtual classes and individualized tutoring
  - 3,686 hours (1,229 sessions) of substance abuse treatment provided
