August Outreach Focus of the Month: St. Peter's Child Care Center

The outreach focus for the month of August is our very own St. Peter's Child Care Center. The Center is a non-profit child care center that provides high quality child care to a diverse population. Over 15% of the families attending St. Peter's Child Care Center are receiving assistance from the local or state agencies.

The Child Care Center and the School Age Program at Horace Mann Elementary have maintained a five-star rating through the Step Up to Quality program. This is the highest rating that is attainable for a program. The Center has also been awarded a contract with Invest in Children as a Universal PreK Program (UPK). The UPK Program makes high quality early care and education accessible to families by providing funding to enhance the quality, as well as scholarship assistance to low- and moderate-income families. Both the Step Up to Quality and UPK Programs require the Center to operate at higher standards than a Program who is just licensed by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.

In keeping with the service ministry that is a part of the St. Peter's culture, the Center is involved in several service projects. The students at the Center participate in monthly outreach projects aimed at improving their community. Some of the recipients of their efforts include Providence House, St. Jude's Children's Hospital, the Pajama Program and the Ronald McDonald House of Cleveland.

You may have heard about the impact that child care has on our overall economy as we all rebound from the COVID-19 pandemic. When working families do not have access to high quality childcare, they cannot work and therefore the need for quality child care is very important. You may also be hearing about the struggles and challenges child care centers are experiencing specifically with the ability to hire and maintain high quality staff. St. Peter's Child Care Center is no different and is in need of teachers and substitutes to ensure we can maintain the high-quality program we have established within the community.
