### **Enriching Our Worship**

You may have noticed that we have been using a different form of the liturgy for our Sunday worship on the past two Sundays. We will continue to use this for the next three Sundays.

"Enriching Our Worship" is an additional resource that was provided by the Standing Liturgical Commission and approved by General Convention, as an enrichment of our liturgical prayer with consent of our Bishop.

The goal was to expand the language, images and metaphors used in worship and recover some ancient biblical images. "Expanding our vocabulary of prayer and the ways in which we name the Holy One bear witness to the fact that the mystery of God transcends all categories of knowing, including those of masculine and feminine."

Though some words and phrases may sound unfamiliar, I hope the questions this experience may generate bring you to a deeper awareness of the presence of God in your life.

I welcome your feedback and conversation about the liturgy.
