Dear St. Peter's Family,

Two rivers that flow together is called their "confluence." The independence of each flowing river converges to bring a new more powerful force of nature. That is a nice illustration of the love shared between two individuals that we celebrate on Valentine's Day: two lives coming together to bring more out of them because they are together. However, this calendar year, Valentine's Day is celebrated on Ash Wednesday. Let me be the first to say, "Happy Valentine's Day, 'Remember you dust and to dust you shall return!' The confluence of these two days suggests not only that each day is a gift that should be appreciated, but that the relationships we share are equally a life-giving gift. Nothing is guaranteed in life except God's unfailing love. We hold our own life as a treasured gift just as we hold sacred our relationships as gifts. On Ash Wednesday we remember our reliance on God for our very existence, just as we remember that the relationships, we value are a gift from God. On February 14th we will offer Ash Wednesday Services with the imposition of Ashes at Noon and 6:30 pm.

Our Lenten journey will return with a Wednesday Evening meal, study and Eucharist beginning February 21. We will share a simple meal of soup, bread, cheese and fruit from 6:00 pm - 6:30 pm. This will be followed by a simple Eucharist and book study of Community by Henri Nouwen.

The Adult Forum study of the 'Story of Scripture' will continue on Sunday Mornings at 9:09 am in the Undercroft and also offered on Wednesdays at 11:00 am in the office class room following the 10 am Eucharist. In February we will be studying Genesis 1-6, the beautiful story of "The beginnings."

I'm so excited about the showing of the film, Philadelphia 11 on February 4th at 4:00 pm in the church. It is a documentary that tells the story of the first eleven women ordained in the Episcopal Church, with our own Mother Nancy Wittig being one of those eleven! Afterwards we will visit with her to hear her thoughts and experience of those days.

I'm excited to journey our first Lenten 40 days together!

What is MS? MS is a chronic, often disabling disease of the central nervous system. Thought to be an auto-immune disease affecting nearly a million people in the US, there is no known cause or cure. Symptoms range from numbness, pain, blindness, cognitive issues to paralysis. An individual's MS progression is unpredictable, sometimes "coming and going" over months, or progressing leading to increased disability.

The National MS Society provides services to people with MS and their families. They invest in research seeking a cure, advocate for patient's rights, and facilitate education on issues such as employment. The Ohio Chapter of the National MS Society is a valuable connection for people with MS to not face a diagnosis alone, and to live their best life.

Each Sunday, you are invited to write out your name on a name tag and wear it so everyone will


know who you are... Permanent name badges are available for ordering!

The extra monies raised for heading out west will be saved possibly through a CD to accrue interest and grow for our trip in 2025. Again, thank you for your support and stay tuned for where we end up in 2024. Wherever we land we will be the hands and feet of Christ building relationship and improving living conditions.

This will be our 16th year sleeping outside on a cold winter night to raise awareness and funds for the local homeless. Most years we battle lake effect snow and temperatures that dip down to single digits. Even with cardboard boxes and tents clustered together, sleeping bags, and layered clothing, we are in for a very cold night! With your help and support we typically raise an average of \$1,500 for local shelters like The Lakeside Men's Shelter, Y-Haven, Front-line, and The Norma Herr Women's Shelter.

Adult Chaperones (NEEDED) keep watch in shifts all night long. As you know Lakewood has a large number of churches and bars so a lot of foot traffic passes by after the last call. Some of this traffic stops by and warms up by our bonfire, treats us to some conversation, and makes donations. On a couple of occasions, we've been able to help someone make it home safely by calling a taxi, this has been a real eye-opener for some of our youth and adults. We will need help with adults taking shifts to watch us and keep us safe, we will also need donations of firewood, food, and drinks. We will be completely dependent upon your generosity.
