Dear St. Peter's Family,

Lent is a time of preparation. For many, it is a season to discipline themselves so they might be ready to receive something deeper from God. It may take the form of negation — giving up something to make room for spiritual reflection on what is more important. For others it may take the form of addition — adding a spiritual practice to enhance their spiritual life. I will leave the "negation" to your own discretion! However, I will take this opportunity to invite you to some opportunities of "addition" that just might become the spiritual habit that you are needing to shake off the doldrums of your spiritual life.

This Lent we will offer times for study, worship and reflection. On Wednesday evenings our Lenten program will focus on building community in our life. The pandemic showed us how much we need one another. Like a plant without the sun, we cannot thrive. Therefore, we will gather at 6:00 p.m. in the new Chapel for a simple Lenten meal of soup, bread, cheese and fruit. At 6:30 p.m. we will have a simple Eucharist, followed by a study of the Henri Nouwen book, *Community*.

If your week nights are full, you are invited to attend the "909" Story of Scripture study in the Undercroft each Sunday. The name is taken from our peculiar starting time ... 9:09 a.m.! This allows our 8 o'clockers to remain and our 10 o'clockers to come just a bit early (and get a great parking space as an extra benefit). We are just starting our study in Genesis, so you can pick up at the beginning and join in on a welcoming and growing community of learners.

If you are looking for a community based around a special interest, NOW is the time to join in. We are looking for you to offer your gifts for the strengthening of our parish, and we are setting up the following oversight committees to more effectively be a missional church. We need volunteers in these areas, and the person to contact appears in parenthesis: Worship (Liz Crosby); Generosity/Outreach (Jan McDonough); Finance (Dan Lammers); Youth and Children (Michelle Killen-Keith); Building and Grounds (John Neumann); and Pastoral Care (Fr. Mike). This committee structure will allow parishioners to strengthen our faith community as they bring their talents into use.


Lent is a time for us to be challenged to a deeper way of being in our spiritual life. Join in! You are needed!!!

In L'Arche, people of all walks of life build relationships rooted in trust and vulnerability. By sharing daily life together, community members can learn true friendship and teach one another to love unconditionally

Here in our Cleveland community we consist of four homes with thirteen core members and approximately twenty-five assistants. We like to think of ourselves as Cleveland's best kept secret. L'Arche Cleveland is one community in the context of a worldwide federation, consisting of over 150 communities across 37 countries.

Brothers' Keeper, affectionately known as "BK," was established in 2000. Based in Ripley, West Virginia and located at Parchment Valley Conference Center on 1715 Parchment Valley Road, BK reaches out to the community for mission projects each year. Most of these are construction projects for low-income families or families with a handicapped member. Youth groups from around West Virginia and surrounding states arrive in Jackson County to do this mission work, and every year BK serves families throughout the county.

BK develops a mind for mission work in more than 100 youth missionaries, adult counselors, and crew chiefs. At the center of its yearly planning is Gospel scripture from the Book of Matthew, Chapter 25, Verse 40. What better way to serve Christ than by serving His Creation?





Psalm 51:10 reads, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me."

Reflect on your newness in Christ as you journey through Episcopal Relief & Development's Lenten Meditations, written by Miguel Escobar, and discover new ways your faith is guiding you through the world.

In 2009, Episcopal Relief & Development published its first Lenten Meditations. The 2024 meditations follow the schedule of readings from the lectionarypage.net, which includes both the Revised Common Lectionary for Sundays and feast days and the daily eucharistic readings. During Lent, we pray, "Create and make in us new and contrite hearts." The meditations focus on embracing this new heart, this new life in Christ, and looking deep within ourselves and acting in ways that seek and serve Christ in others.

Miguel Escobar authored this year's meditations. Miguel is an Episcopal Relief & Development Board member and the Director of Strategy & Operations at the Episcopal Divinity School in New York City. Throughout his studies and professional life, he has helped many discern and strengthen their call to ministry. He is a thoughtful person who cares that the most vulnerable among us are treated justly. You will get a taste of Miguel's life experiences and personal convictions in this year's meditations.

We are praying for you, and we ask that you pray for Episcopal Relief & Development as well. Prayer is powerful, and when we pray for each other, we truly are working together for lasting change.

If you have not already done so, please return your pledge card to help the office. Remember, we are asking for one-and one-half times your stewardship pledge for this effort, payable over a three-year period.


If you have lost your pledge card, call the church office and they will be happy to provide a new one.
