April Outreach Focus of the Month:



The April Outreach Focus of the Month is our own camp, retreat, and educational center for the Diocese of Ohio — Bellwether Farm. Its vision and mission, in part, is to "promote physical and spiritual wellness and fidelity to the environment while providing a sacred space that awakens our senses to all that is possible in God's creation and live more lightly on the earth." To that end, Bellwether is a working farm with sheep, goats, chickens, bees, pigs, and a horse! All meals at the center are served farm-to-table, applying all the appropriate recycling/sustainability practices. During the warmer months, guests are encouraged to help Farm-to-Table Director Jay Gillet gather the very food they will eat while at the farm. Be prepared to be served the most delicious meals!

Located along the Vermilion River in Wakeman, Ohio, Bellwether is an idyllic setting for young ones to enjoy a camp experience. The lake on the property offers the opportunity for swimming, canoeing, and fishing. Campers stay in beautiful wooden cabins nestled in the gorgeous woods surrounding the center — woods that provide miles of hiking, foraging, and exploration. Campers also enjoy the fellowship of surrounding campfires, music, arts and crafts, and worship. They will also participate in the farm experience by harvesting their own food and animal life.

Organ Campaign Update

Fellow Parishioners:



I am pleased to report that we now have 76 pledges totaling \$402,295 to refurbish our wonderful Holtkamp organ. This is really exciting! Thank you to all who have gotten us to this point!

There are still a fair number of parishioners who, while having pledged to the annual stewardship campaign, *have not yet* committed to supporting our organ campaign. I have some important news to share, however, that I believe will encourage those people to

step up and make their financial commitment to this important project.

A generous donor has pledged to match—dollar for dollar—up to \$100,000 to St. Peter's to help us reach our goal of \$650,000. Even those who have already committed their support can increase their pledge and see that increase to their gift doubled.

Here's how that matching pledge has advanced our cause: For the week of March 25, we received \$16,185, bringing our actual total for the week to \$418,480.

This pledge-matching initiative is a true "Alleluia!" moment, a significant step toward helping us reach the finish line. Our goal is now within our sights.

In our continued effort to reach out to everyone, the committee has decided to send one more mailing to those folks who have not yet sent in a pledge card. We want to make sure they are aware of this donor's incredibly generous gift, and to appeal, once again, for a contribution. There has never been a better time to show your support for our extraordinary music program.

Pledge cards are still available on the table in the back of the church, so please consider taking one with you the next time you visit St. Peter's.

On behalf of the committee, I want to extend my deepest gratitude to this friend of St. Peter's, and to thank *you* for supporting this worthy and important project.

"Safe Church, Safe Communities" is the new training developed for the Episcopal Church for the protection of children, youth, and vulnerable adults. This training is entirely online, and replaces Safeguarding God's Children and Safeguarding God's People. According to diocesan policy, the following people are required to complete Safe Church Training every three years:

- Clergy
- Paid staff
- Volunteers and staff who work with children and youth
- Elected positions and other lay leadership
- People with keys to the building

were overlooked during the pandemic, please let Michelle Killin-Keith know if you need a bible.





History Wanted for Ascension's Sesquicentennial



Next year, the Church of the Ascension — our neighbor to the east on Detroit Road — will celebrate its 150th anniversary.

Ascension enjoys the distinction of having operated continuously in the city of Lakewood since 1875, making it, according to the Lakewood Historical Society, the oldest church in the city.


