Dear St. Peter's Family,

In 2020, the pandemic forced St. Peter's to think on its feet and do church in a new way. YouTube allowed us to broadcast our services to your computer or cellphone, keeping you connected to church when attending worship was impossible. YouTube continues to keep all of us connected when we are away from Lakewood. It is a kind of looking glass — letting us view things from far away. But that is just one side of the mirror. YouTube also lets us present ourselves to the world. We can show the beauty of our worship or music or liturgy to anyone who is looking for a church home. It is a safe way for seekers to see what happens behind these stone walls. You will soon notice an improvement in the way that we capture video for our livestreams — inspired by that other side of the looking glass.

Because we want to showcase our very best to all who might want to view our services, the vestry, as an act of mission, approved an updated livestreaming production system that features three camera positions, new microphones for improved sound, and a control desk at the back of the church. (No more camera in the second pew!) This set-up will be less intrusive to the in-person worshipper and of far better quality for the home viewer. If ever there was a win-win scenario, this is it! The installation and kick-off broadcast will take place this month. We are especially grateful to Dave Tabar, whose experience and insights made this venture possible. We will need additional “ministers of livestreaming,” so watch for your opportunity to be a trained member of this team.

I am grateful to announce that our search for an Office Manager is complete as we welcome Johnny Kaufman to this key role on our staff. He has extensive experience in higher education office administration, and is a fellow Episcopalian from St. Paul's in Cleveland Heights. He will work 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Mondays and Wednesdays, and half-days on Tuesdays and Fridays. Stop by the office and introduce yourself to him.

I am also excited to draw your attention to an update on the organ renovation fundraising campaign found in these pages: The campaign has topped \$600,000! Your faithfulness is truly astounding. I want to express thanksgiving to Mike Bickerton, Bryan Mitnaul, and the entire Organ Committee for their leadership, wisdom, and hard work in keeping everything on track. Thank you to EVERYONE for your gifts that make this possible.

Finally, there was so much energy to keep studying the Bible from our 9:09 Adult Sunday School class that we will keep it rolling throughout the summer. We will also continue the Wednesday 11 a.m. Bible Study following the 10 a.m. Eucharist. Just watch for the occasional off time for my vacation weeks.

June Outreach Focus of the Month



Our June Outreach Partner of the Month is the ALS Association. Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, more commonly known as Lou Gehrig’s Disease, was responsible for the tragic deaths of two of our beloved parishioners, Jack Bauer (husband of Cherie Bauer) and Harold Babbit (husband of Jan Babbit). Both men were diagnosed in the prime of their life with this incurable disease and are missed terribly to this day.

ALS is a terminal neurodegenerative disorder that results in the progressive loss of both upper and lower motor neurons that normally control voluntary muscle contractions. It presents with muscle stiffness, twitches, or weakness in its early stages and progresses to having the inability to eat, speak, move, and breathe. There is no known cause for ALS, and there is no cure; treatments for the disease simply help to slow progression and improve symptoms. Although ALS can affect people of any age, it typically strikes between the ages of 40 and 70 and targets males more often than females. Survival after diagnosis is often only two to four years.

The ALS Association is the only national non-profit organization fighting ALS, and it leads the way in research, care services, public education, and public policy. The association strives to provide hope and empowerment to those afflicted with this disease.

If you visit the ALS Association site on the internet, the first words you encounter are “compassion, integrity, and urgency.” These words seem very appropriate after witnessing the progression of the disease with Jack and Harold. Our hope for the St. Peter’s family is that you give generously to this organization to put an end to this tragic affliction.

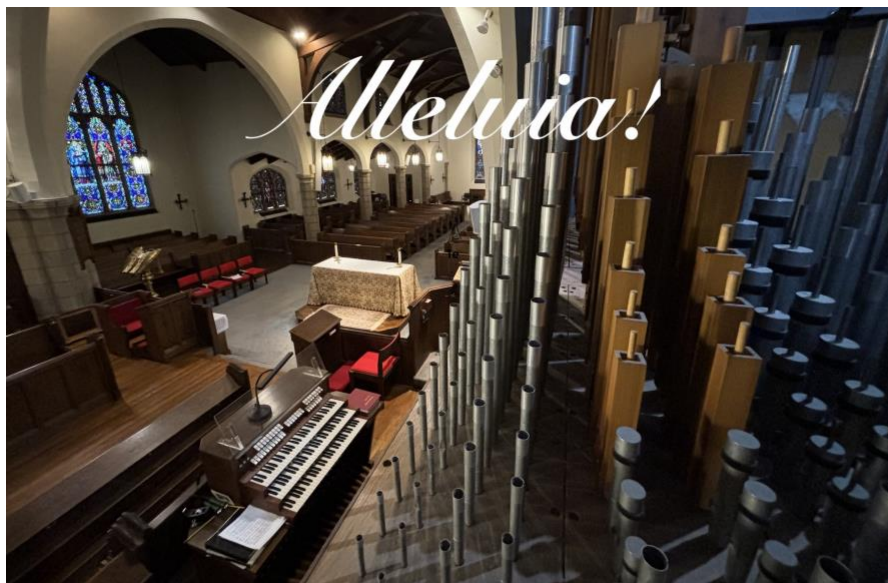
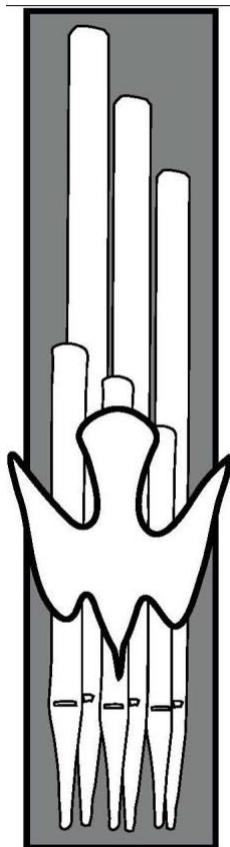

Organ Campaign Update

When in Our Music God is Glorified

Fellow Parishioners:

In January of this year, we asked for your help in supporting the repair and refurbishment of our 1959 Holtkamp organ. At that time, we explained that deferred maintenance over the past decades resulted in a failure of the organ's leather pouches — its integral “living parts.” So profound was this deterioration that when organist and choirmaster Bryan Mitnaul depressed certain keys, no sound emanated from the pipes. These “dead notes” limited his ability to create the glorious music so central to our liturgy. That our organ has held on for as long as it has, with minimal maintenance, has been a testament to its value and quality. As we sought to repair and enhance our organ, you heard our call for help!

In the last five months you responded with a generosity that has been inspiring. In May, the campaign reached a benchmark “Alleluia!” moment: We have raised, in funds and pledges, more than \$600,000 towards our goal of \$650,000. We are very much in the home stretch of the campaign!

There are so many people to thank, especially the generous members who support our parish, and we intend to honor you for your magnificent philanthropy. For now, please accept my humble thanks on behalf of the organ committee, and know that we will keep you apprised as we move towards the very real and visible manifestation of your gifts.

What is a Verger? (With Thanks to Martha Taylor)

Verger (vūr'jər), *n.* *Chiefly Brit.* A uniquely Anglican or Episcopalian term used to describe the lay person who assists in the ordering of the service. The name derives from the British term for *wandsman* (staff), which the verger carries to bring the service to order.

The success of Sunday worship depends in large part on a flawless presentation. We enjoy that transcendental experience when distractions are kept to a minimum: lectors read on cue, acolytes process with the sound of the organ, chalice bearers ensure that the communion rail moves along at a steady pace. The Verger keeps chaos to a minimum.

In 2000, Reverend Carol Cole Flanagan formed a worship committee that included Martha, and which was designed to facilitate morning worship. Martha and I asked her if it might be helpful to have someone manage the Sunday morning liturgical participants — ensure their attendance, review changes in the liturgy, etc. In response, she said, “Oh! That’s a verger!” and she promptly appointed us to the roles. Since then, Martha and I have shared the responsibility of making sure that Sunday mornings proceed as planned. Before each service we search for the cast of characters assigned to the Sunday Rota. Occasionally, we will take on a role for an absent participant. Always, we make sure that “the show goes on.”

We assist Father Mike in this, making sure that everyone involved in the liturgy is prepared to execute their respective roles. We also help train the lay participants — acolytes, chalice bearers, readers, ushers, and bell ringers — and we typically prepare the schedule, or Rota.

After 24 years of shepherding the Sunday cast, Martha Taylor has earned a rest. She will retire her staff on May 26. Speaking as her “partner in crime,” I will miss our talks, our joint efforts to account for all the sheep, our evaluation of the economies of motion, our recommendations for improvement. But I am grateful that in 2000 she embarked on this mission with me, one that has been so important to us both, to our relationship to St. Peter’s and all of you, and to the integrity of St. Peter’s Sunday worship.

To be clear, Martha isn’t going *anywhere*! She will remain a vital resource for many of St. Peter’s ministries, including sharing responsibility for Outreach and Stewardship. But she will no longer be my partner in “hunting you down” on Sunday morning, so please join me in thanking her for her service.

Welcome Sarah Taylor

Martha’s shoes are hard to fill. After much discernment, we are grateful and pleased to announce that Sarah Taylor (no relation) has agreed to accept the role of Verger beginning on June 2. Those of you involved in liturgy and Sunday service should now be on the lookout for either Sarah or me.

If you are assigned to any of the Sunday worship roles, please make sure to check in with the Verger upon arrival. If you are assigned to Sunday worship duties but cannot make it to church, kindly text me (216-502-6426) or Sarah (216-939-1776) as soon as possible so that a replacement can be found.

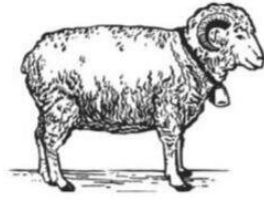

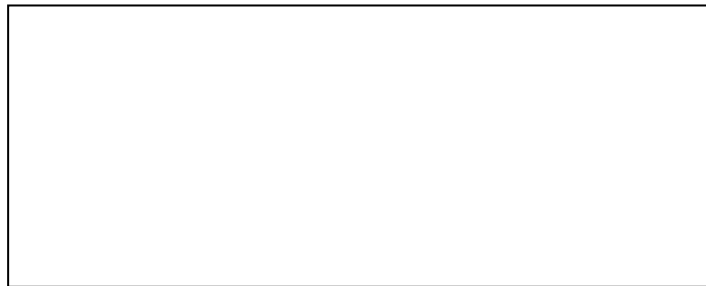
