**IF YOU'RE NEW** this morning, please take a moment to fill out one of the little cards at the end of the pew rack and place it in the alms basin at the offering. Or you can sign our guestbook by the tower door on your way out. We want to welcome you properly.

**A WORD ABOUT OFFERINGS:** Loose cash and coins put in our offering plates on Sundays are used to fund important ministries in the wider community. Your loose cash will go to the Outreach Partner of the Month. If you prefer that your cash offerings go to church operations, or if you wish a tax receipt, you must put your offerings in an envelope and supply your name. Envelopes for this purpose can be found at the end of every pew.

**A WORD ABOUT COMMUNION:** We offer bread\* and wine during Holy Communion. We believe that we receive the full benefit of the sacrament in each kind. You are invited to receive the wine from the chalice by drinking. A second, smaller chalice is available for intinction; gently touch the wafer to the wine in the smaller chalice.

**ASSISTANCE DEVICES** are available for anyone who has difficulty hearing. They can be found on a small table by the tower door, or see one of the ushers.

**RESTROOMS** are located between the Church and the Chapel off the Narthex.

**CHILDREN:** All children are welcome to join Michelle Killin-Keith before worship in the Fellowship Narthex outside the Chapel for Christian Formation Classes. Children are also welcome to attend the service; activity sheets are available at the back of the church for your use. Children may use the carpet in the front of the church to participate in an activity and be part of the service.



## The Lessons

*Lector* A Reading from the Book of the Wisdom of Solomon.

## HOLY BAPTISM

### The Presentation and Examination of the Candidates:

**Charlotte Kay Geiger Deasy, Lily Christine Geiger Deasy, and Noah John Schlesinger**

*Celebrant* The Candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*Parents & Godparents* I present Charlotte Kay to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Parents & Godparents* I present Lily Christine to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*Parents & Godparents* I present Noah John to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

*The Celebrant now addresses the parents and godparents:*

*Celebrant* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is brought up in the Christian faith and life?

*Parents & Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

*Parents & Godparents* I will, with God's help.

*Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and godparents:*

*Question* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* I renounce them.

*Question* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

*Answer* I do.

*Question* Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* I do.

*The Celebrant now addresses the congregation:*

*Celebrant* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their lives in Christ?

*People* We will.

*Celebrant* Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## **The Baptismal Covenant**

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

*Celebrant* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

*People* I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

*Celebrant* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

*Celebrant* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

*People* I will, with God's help.



*Celebrant* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

*Celebrant* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?  
*People* I will, with God's help.

### **The Prayers for the Candidates**

*The Celebrant then says to the congregation:*

Let us now pray for Charlotte Kay, Lily Christine, and Noah John, who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

*Intercessor* Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Open their hearts to your grace and truth.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Send them into the world in witness to your love.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Intercessor* Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory.

*People* Lord, hear our prayer.

*Celebrant* Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever.

*People* Amen.

## **Thanksgiving over the Water**

*The Celebrant blesses the water then proceeds:*

*Celebrant* The Lord be with you.

*People* And also with you.

*Celebrant* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*People* It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*Celebrant* We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*At the following words, the Celebrant touches the water:*

*Celebrant* Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever.

*People* Amen.

## **The Baptism**

*The candidates are presented by name to the Celebrant who pours water upon them, saying:*

*Celebrant* Charlotte Kay, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Lily Christine, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Noah John, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Let us pray:

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon your servants, Charlotte Kay, Lily Christine, and Noah John, the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

*People* Amen.

*Then the Celebrant places a hand on each child's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross with Chrism and says:*

*Celebrant* Charlotte Kay, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Lily Christine, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Noah John, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever.

*People* Amen.

*Celebrant* Let us welcome the newly baptized.

*People* We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

*The newly baptized Christians are presented to the Church.*

*Celebrant* *The Lord be with you.*

*People* *And also with you.*

*Celebrant* *Lift up your hearts*

*People* *We lift them to the Lord.*

*Celebrant* *Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.*

*People* *It is right to give our thanks and praise.*

*Celebrant* *It is truly right to glorify you, Father, and to give you thanks; for you alone are God, living and true, dwelling in light inaccessible from before time and for ever. Fountain of life and source of all goodness, you made all things and fill them with your blessing; you created them to rejoice in the splendor of your radiance. Countless throngs of angels stand before you to serve you night and day; and, beholding the glory of your presence, they offer you unceasing praise. Joining with them, and giving voice to every creature under heaven, we acclaim you, and glorify your Name, as we sing:*

Ho - ly, ho - ly, ho - ly Lord, God of pow - er and  
might, hea - ven and earth are full of your glo - ry. Ho -  
san - na in the high - est. Bless - ed is he who  
comes in the name of the Lord. Ho - san - na in the high - est.

*The people may stand or kneel. The Celebrant continues:*

We acclaim you, holy Lord, glorious in power. Your mighty works reveal your wisdom and love. You formed us in your own image, giving the whole world into our care, so that, in obedience to you, our Creator, we might rule and serve all your creatures. When our disobedience took us far from you, you did not abandon us to the power of death. In your mercy you came to our help, so that in seeking you we might find you. Again and again you called us into covenant with you, and through the prophets you taught us to hope for salvation. Father, you loved the world so much that in the fullness of time you sent your only Son to be our Savior. Incarnate by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, he lived as one of us, yet without sin. To the poor he proclaimed the good news of salvation; to prisoners, freedom; to the sorrowful, joy.

To fulfill your purpose he gave himself up to death; and, rising from the grave, destroyed death, and made the whole creation new. And, that we might live no longer for ourselves, but for him who died and rose for us, he sent the Holy Spirit, his own first gift for those who believe, to complete his work in the world, and to bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

When the hour had come for him to be glorified by you, his heavenly Father, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end; at supper with them he took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my

Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, “Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

Father, we now celebrate this memorial of our redemption. Recalling Christ’s death and his descent among the dead, proclaiming his resurrection and ascension to your right hand, awaiting his coming in glory; and offering to you, from the gifts you have given us, this bread and this cup, we praise you and we bless you.

*Celebrant & People* We praise you, we bless you, we give thanks to you, and we pray to you,  
Lord our God.

*Celebrant* Lord, we pray that in your goodness and mercy your Holy Spirit may descend upon us, and upon these gifts, sanctifying them and showing them to be holy gifts for your holy people, the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Grant that all who share this bread and cup may become one body and one spirit, a living sacrifice in Christ, to the praise of your Name. Remember, Lord, your one holy catholic and apostolic Church, redeemed by the blood of your Christ. Reveal its unity, guard its faith, and preserve it in peace.

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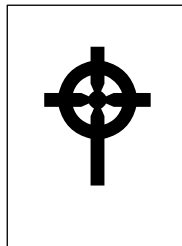
