Dear St. Peter's Family,

The icon of St. Peter receiving the Keys to the Kingdom, a generous gift from Father Keith Owen upon his retirement after 17 years as rector, graces our chapel. Icons are more than mere images; they are windows into deeper spiritual realities, meant to be “looked through” rather than simply “looked at,” and are believed to be channels of God’s grace.

This Lenten season, I want to pair the ancient medium of icons with the modern medium of podcasts. Faith-based podcasts allow us to “listen through” others’ conversations, finding insights for our own spiritual lives. I was recently introduced to an Episcopal podcast that I truly enjoy, called “The Average Episcopalian.” Hosted by two Ohioan sisters – Kate Greer and Annie Hodges – who grew up in the Episcopal Church, it brings humor and insightful perspectives to conversations about the Episcopal Church, its worship, and its teachings. It reminds me of the conversations my family had when our daughters were in college and began to ask the tough questions about faith. The sisters’ podcast is like an audio icon of faith for our modern world.

In our Wednesday Lenten service, I will pair a Traditional Orthodox Icon with a Podcast Episode from Kate and Annie! Below you can find the schedule of Wednesday Eucharists (6:00 p.m.), Simple Lenten Suppers (6:30 p.m.), and Study (7:00 p.m.). Just listen to the podcast ahead of time and you’ll be ready for the discussion. There will also be supplementary reading materials to pick up on Sundays. We will laugh and learn together this Lent!

To download this podcast to your iPhone or Android phone, simply open up your Podcast App (this is pre-installed on every iPhone and on some Android phones), click on the search button, then type in the name of the podcast. The podcast logo is on the bottom-right of this page so you’ll know you found the correct one.

- March 12 – Lent: The Great Punch in the Face (S1, E15) + Icon: The Divine Ascent

- March 26 – Jesus is not Thor (S1, E7) + Icon: Vladimir’s Theotakos
- April 2 – We Still Don’t Know How to Pray (S1, E9) + Icon: The Prayer of the Cup
- April 9 – It’s All About Relationships (S1, E16) + Icon: The Three Visitors

### **LifeAct**



Founded in 1992, LifeAct's mission is to prevent suicide by educating young people to recognize the warning signs of suicide and to seek professional help. LifeAct's programs are provided at no cost to participating schools to ensure equal access to lifesaving mental health education. Programs include:

- 1) Suicide Prevention for students in Grades 6-12
- 2) Stress Management for Grades 5-12
- 3) QPR Training (Question, Persuade, Refer) for adults

Last school year (2023-2024), LifeAct set a service record, delivering programs to a 48,347 middle and high school students in 203 public, private, and charter schools in 17 Northeast Ohio counties.

### THE CHANCEL GUILD?

**The Chancel Guild is a traditional ministry working quietly behind the scenes to prepare the church for worship each week.** The Guild has many essential weekly functions including: ensuring that the wine, water, and wafers are ready for the minister to serve; placing candles on the altar; arranging flowers; ordering supplies; laundering the fair linen; and caring for the communion vessels and the altar frontals. The Guild also prepares for religious holidays. Anyone can join the Chancel Guild (particularly for the 8:00 a.m. service each week) as no experience is necessary. Each element of the service – the music, the altar hangings, the architecture, even the people in the pews – draws us closer to God by inviting us to bring our very best and lay it upon the altar. The flowers bedecking the altar are an important and radiant symbol of what we offer to God in our worship.

Altar flowers also present an added dimension to the worship experience. They don't simply create beauty; they provide a "pick-me-up" to those in need, they help to celebrate momentous occasions, and they are shared with some of our homebound parishioners to help brighten their days.

Every parishioner is invited to enhance the loveliness of our worship by donating altar flowers on a particular Sunday – either for the glory of God, or in memory, thanksgiving, or celebration of the important people and events in your life.

With the exception of the Lenten season, many Sundays are available for you to purchase altar flowers. Two regular bouquets cost \$90; two larger, special bouquets cost \$150. If you wish to share a Sunday with another parishioner, the cost will be divided between you. 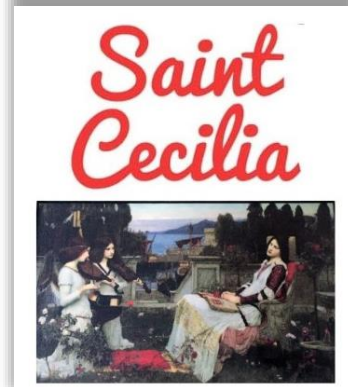

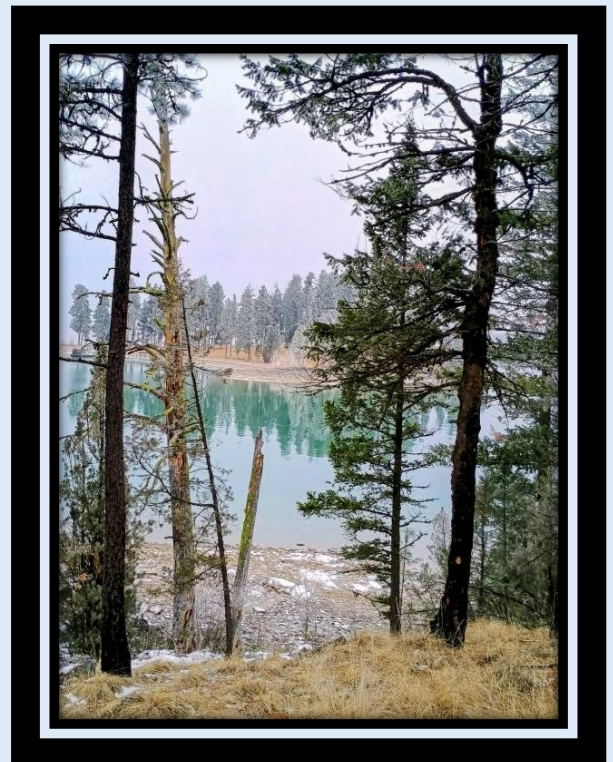

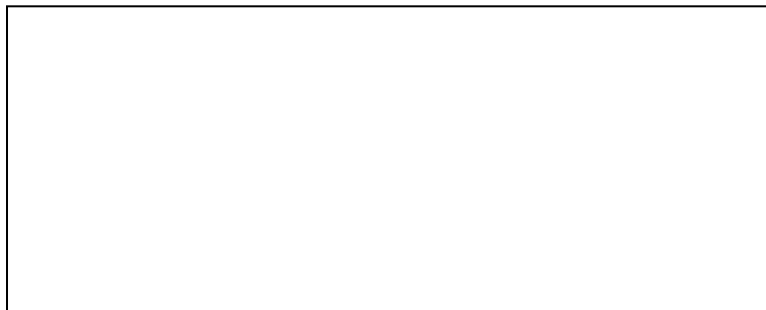
