Dear St. Peter's Family,

The older I get, the more comfort I find in the cycles of life. The wonder of the changing of the seasons – winter's crisp cold air, spring's daffodils breaking through the frozen ground, warmth of a long summer day, or apple picking as the leaves change their color. Likewise, the sacred cycle of the Church Year is ever-repeating and ever new. The long ordinary-time of the season after Pentecost now welcomes the preparations of Advent that will take us into the 12 days of Christmas.

Advent holds us in a kind of holy tension: we remember the historical miracle of Jesus's birth, while preparing our hearts for Christ's ultimate return. It is a time for quiet reflection on what has taken place in history as well as the hope we share in what is to come. The spiritual cycle of birth and return is held in holy tension throughout Advent.

The church is shod in purple in Advent – the color purple signifies the spiritual preparation of introspection in this season that makes our heart ready to receive Christ, both in the Nativity and His Second Coming. The Advent Candle is lit before each service, symbolizing the growing light of Christ steadily overcoming the darkness of the world. The Chrismon Tree is an evergreen that you are invited to help decorate with the symbols of our faith, and acknowledges the eternal life we find in Christ.

All of this Advent preparation is meant to make us ready for the celebration that culminate in the central celebration of Christmas! We warmly invite you to join us for our special services:

Christmas Eve 4:00 p.m. The Service of the Holy Nativity with Holy Eucharist features the beloved “drop-in pageant” for all children. This wonderful service is specifically child friendly while being sacred and holy.

Christmas Eve 10:00 p.m. A Solemn Choral Holy Eucharist in celebration of the Holy Nativity is a reverent and beautiful candlelight service with our full choir.

Christmas Day 10:00 a.m. Is a reflective morning of Eucharistic celebration of the birth of our Savior.

Christmas Lessons and Carols will be celebrated on December 28th at our 10:00 a.m. service. (The 8:00 a.m. service will be our regular Holy Eucharist service)

As the growing light of the Advent candles leads us out of the stillness of preparation and into the joyful brilliance of Christmas, we remember that Christ comes to us in every season and every cycle. I look forward to sharing the wonder of Advent preparations and Christmas celebrations with you!

Monthly Outreach

December Outreach Focus of the Month: St. Peter's Child Care Center

The outreach focus for the month of October is our very own St. Peter's Child Care Center. The Center is a non-profit childcare center that provides high quality childcare to a diverse population. We have been a part of the community since 1983 and serve families from Lakewood, Cleveland, Mentor, Chesterland, Avon Lake, Westlake, Fairview Park and Rocky River.

We currently have 32 families (43 children) at the Center. Our staff is made up of 12 full-time and 3 part-time employees. Three of our staff have been with us for 23 and 24 years, while others have recently celebrated anywhere between 1-11 years of employment with us. We provide a safe, nurturing environment for the children and welcome children of all abilities.

In May, we made the difficult decision to close our School Age Program at Horace Mann Elementary School. This Program had been in operation for more than 25 years for the families, but lately we have faced staffing challenges for the Program and found another local Program to take over at Horace Mann for the families.

The Child Care Center has maintained a Gold rating through the Step Up to Quality program. This is the highest rating that is attainable for a program. The Center has also maintained a contract with Invest in Children as a Universal PreK Program (UPK). The UPK Program makes high quality early care and education accessible to families by providing funding to enhance the quality, as well as scholarship assistance to low- and moderate-income families. Both the Step Up to Quality and UPK Programs require the Center to operate at higher standards than a Program who is just licensed by the Ohio Department of Children and Youth. We have also maintained the designation of Ohio Healthy Program for the past 11 years. Ohio Healthy Programs focus on creating healthy habits, menus, policies and family engagement to address childhood obesity. Each of these different programs do provide a small amount of financial incentive, however as a non-profit childcare center we consistently seek out opportunities to fund our Program to provide a worthy wage for our staff. In keeping with the service ministry that is a part of the St. Peter's culture, the Center is involved in several service projects. The children at the Center participate in outreach projects aimed at improving their community. Some of the beneficiaries of their efforts include Providence House, St. Jude's Children's Hospital, the Pajama Program and the Ronald McDonald House of Cleveland. We thank you for the support you have given us over the years and appreciate you thinking of us once again. Your generous donations will be used to maintain our playground area and supplement some of the rising operational costs we have faced at the Center.

However, there are about 35 pledges that have not been received, so please continue to return your 2026 pledge cards if you have not yet gotten them into the church! It truly does help tremendously to know what each household is planning to contribute so that next year's budget can be finalized!

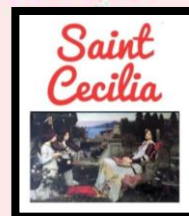

THE 209TH ANNUAL CONVENTION OF THE EPISCOPAL DIOCESE OF OHIO



On Friday November 14 and Saturday November 15 over 225 Episcopalians gathered at Greystone Event Center in Wooster, Ohio to attend the Annual Convention. This year's event was marked by a special celebration of the 90th birthday of Bishop Arthur Williams, Jr.

St. Peter's was well represented. In addition to delegates Dennis Driscoll, Leslie Price and Liz Crosby, Father Mike and Kim attended as well as Senior Warden Nat Pendleton and Jeff Tennant.

On Saturday, elections were held for various offices. St. Peter's has much for which to be proud. Jeff Tennant was overwhelmingly elected as a Diocesan Trustee and Mike Bickerton, though unopposed, was elected as Diocesan Treasurer.

As with last year's focus, the Bishop emphasized the importance of congregational development, calling on all of us to expand our parish life and ministries into our greater communities. "Congregational Life – the full, specific and local manifestation of the body of Christ in all its complexity – is the source of our transformation..."

Sources of transformation include Prayer and Worship, Study & Learning, Action and Life in our Community. Bishop Jolly called on us to examine in which of these four areas the Holy Spirit is most prevalent or influential at St. Peter's. Where might the Holy Spirit be trying to get our attention in another Source of Transformation? How do our current strengths help us to expand our attention to other areas of transformation?

We invite everyone at St. Peter's to reflect on Bishop Jolly's invitation: Where is the Holy Spirit most active at St. Peter's? Where is the Holy Spirit trying to get our attention in another source of Transformation?
