The insights of Epiphanytide are giving way to the self-reflection of the Lenten Season. We begin Lent with the liturgy of Ash Wednesday where we commit ourselves to intentional work on our deepest self--our soul. To support your Lenten discipline, we offer the following opportunities for prayer, worship, and study: February 18 @ 12:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. – Ash Wednesday with imposition of Ashes.

Wednesday Eucharist with Anointing for Healing @ 10:00 a.m. in the Oratory

Wednesday Bible Study @ 11:00 a.m. and the 9:09 Sunday Bible Study

Wednesday Evening Lenten Program @ 6:00 p.m. in the new Chapel

This year's Lenten Program will be a special offering of faith found in modern films:

*“Wrestling with the Divine: A spiritual reflection on the Academy Award (Oscar) nominees for ‘Best Picture 2026’.”* I know it is a long title 😊 but this will be ‘real-life’ spiritual stuff.

We will follow the familiar schedule for Lenten Wednesday evenings: 6:00 pm Holy Eucharist; 6:30 pm Simple Soup Supper; 6:45 Lesson and Discussion.

**February 25** – *Frankenstein & Bugonia* (What makes us human?)

**March 4** – *Sinners & Marty Supreme* (Why do we fail?)

**March 11** – *Hamnet & Sentimental Value* (Where is God in our pain?)

**March 18** – *One Battle After Another & The Secret Agent* (How do we live justly?)

**March 25**– *F1 & Train Dreams* (What is our ultimate finish line?)

Each week we will dive into the themes and discover spiritual insights to reflect upon in our own life. I will be scheduling times to see one of the movies each week in a theater (i.e., some are foreign or only showing on streaming services), and you are invited to attend with me. There will be a sign-up sheet in the back of the church if you'd like to get an email for time/place of the movie. (You can come to see the film even if you can't make it on Wednesday evenings.)

# ALS

Our February Outreach Partner of the Month is ALS: Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis, or more commonly known as Lou Gehrig's Disease. It is the disease responsible for the tragic death of two of our beloved parishioners, Jack Bauer (husband of Cherie Bauer) & Harold Babbit (husband of Jan Babbit). Both men were diagnosed in the prime of their life with this incurable disease and are missed terribly to this day.

ALS is a terminal neurodegenerative disorder that results in the progressive loss of both upper and lower motor neurons that normally control voluntary muscle contractions. It presents with muscle stiffness, twitches, or weakness in its early stages and progresses to having the inability to eat, speak, move, and breathe. There is no known cause for ALS. Treatments for the disease simply help to slow progression and improve symptoms.

Though ALS can affect people of any age, it typically strikes between the ages of 40-70 and targets males more often than females. Survival after diagnosis is often only 2-4 years. The ALS Association is the only national non-profit organization fighting ALS.

The association is leading the way in research, care services, public education, and public policy. They are striving to provide hope and empowerment to those afflicted with this terrible disease.

In December 2025 it's been reported that the federal government's switch to full-year funding cut some ALS programs, including a 60% cut (\$40 million) to the Department of Defense's ALS Research Program and a \$250 million loss for the NIH this fiscal year. ALS Association advocacy helped achieve a recommendation for funding the National ALS Registry and Biodepository at the CDC, although it is subject to further budget negotiations. The Registry is critical for finding patterns that lead to understanding of causes and hopefully finding cures. Any cuts slow desperately needed progress.

According to the Association, every ninety minutes someone is diagnosed with ALS and someone dies of it. It is the Association's plan to turn ALS from 100% fatal to 100% liveable and then to cure it.

Visit the site [ALS.org](http://ALS.org) to stay updated on the funding issues and their progress. Their site begins with the words "compassion, integrity, and urgency." These words seem very appropriate after witnessing the progression of the disease with Jack and Harold. Our hope for the St. Peter's family is that you give generously to this organization to help us end this tragic affliction.

# CONFIRMATION CLASS

We will begin a Confirmation Class for those youth who turn 13 by September. We will meet Sunday's during our regularly scheduled Bible study. We will begin on Sunday, April 19th. We will meet on Sundays through June 7th. Our classes will conclude with a retreat in August, and the Bishop will perform the Sacrament of Confirmation on the first Sunday in September. We will begin with an exploration of the Sacrament and the elements therein. A sort of "Why are we here?" and "What is Confirmation?"

## St. Peter's New Children & Youth Choir

St Peter's first Choir for Children and Youth in decades sang beautifully at the 4 pm Christmas Eve service and at the Lessons and Carols service on December 28.

This choir program, which is a collaboration between youth and music ministries, began in November 2025, is directed by Erin Oselu, who is a children's music therapist, and accompanied by Charles Eversole, who is a former director of the Singing Angels. This unique combination of talented leadership and musical expertise provides an excellent opportunity for musical training for our children and youth.

While most churches have given up on the prospect of a choir for their children, St Peter's is now one of the few churches in the area that offers such an opportunity. This is especially valuable because schools are no longer offering music programs or have severely curtailed the programs that they currently provide. The cost of private music lessons to make up for this deficiency can exceed \$50/hour, while participation in the Choir for Children and Youth is provided free of charge.

It is important to note that it has been proven that musical training has a direct impact on improved academic performance. Also, many colleges provide scholarships for those applicants with musical training, and participation in a choir can be listed as a valuable extracurricular activity on college applications.

The other thing that is unique in our situation is that this program was created in direct response to a request by our youth.

The choir rehearsals are held on Sundays after the 10 am service and last for 30 minutes. A light lunch is provided before rehearsal. The choir is open to children and youth from ages 5 and up, and no audition is required.
