LAKESWOOD 4th of JULY EVENTS

Lakewood hosts one of the best and most beloved Fourth of July celebrations in the greater Cleveland area, drawing residents and visitors for a full day of community pride, entertainment, and classic holiday traditions.

The festivities begin at 10:00 AM with the city's popular Fourth of July Parade, which marches down Lake Avenue with a lively mix of community groups, local organizations, and patriotic displays. Families line the street early to get a good spot, making it one of the most anticipated parades in the region.

In the evening, Lakewood Park becomes the centerpiece of the celebration. At 7:00 PM, the Lakewood Project, Lakewood High School's acclaimed rock orchestra, takes the stage at the historic Lakewood Park Bandstand.

Chicago White Sox at Cleveland Guardians

Nothing is more patriotic than a hot dog, beer and baseball. Skip the barbecue and watch as the Cleveland Guardians play against the Chicago White Sox at Progressive Field. There will be a patriotic cap giveaway for the first 15,000 fans to enter the stadium, as well as a Phantom Fireworks display at the conclusion of the game. Celebrate Independence Day with America's favorite pastime and electrifying atmosphere. *July 4, 7:10 p.m.*

Salute to America at Blossom Music Center

Blossom Music Center once again hosts Salute to America, a traditionally styled celebration jam-packed with festival bands, a salute to the armed forces and a

spectacular fireworks display to wrap it up. *July 4, 8 p.m., 1145 W. Steels Corners Road, Cuyahoga Falls*

Grindstone Festival

Berea's premier Fourth of July celebration offers fun for all ages, featuring paddleboat rides on picturesque Coe Lake, live music performances and engaging activities like inflatables for the kids. Savor delicious treats from a variety of food vendors as you listen to the sound of the live music. The highlight of the evening is a spectacular, dazzling fireworks show over Coe Lake. Start the day off watching the parade at 11 a.m., and settle in for a day of celebration. *Free, July 4, noon-10 p.m., Coe Lake Park, Berea.*

Avon Lake's 250th Jubilee

Come hungry to Avon Lake's 250th Jubilee, where a lineup of food trucks, dessert vendors, contests and live entertainment leads up to a fireworks display over Weiss Field. The evening's headliner is 97 Crosses, a John Mellencamp tribute band, performing before the 10 p.m. fireworks finale. *Free, July 3, 4-10 p.m., Weiss Field, 33401 Webber Road, Avon Lake.*

Freedom Festival at Victory Park

Victory Park Ohio's Freedom Festival packs an evening of family-friendly entertainment into its sprawling outdoor complex. The celebration features inflatables, carnival games, sports activities, pony rides, a Ninja Warrior course, performances by the Performance Dogs of Ohio and Jungle Bob, plus food, drinks and live music throughout the night. Stick around for a fireworks display capped by a grand finale. *July 3, 4-11 p.m., 7777 Victory Lane, North Ridgeville,*
